As we enter Holy Week, stir our souls with holy sorrow, and awaken in us a longing for true conversion.


Let us not rush past the Cross, but pause to behold the depth of Your love— a love that bears all things, redeems all things, and calls us to become saints in Your image.

Eucharistic Adoration


Adoration is held in the St. Joseph Chapel Monday through Wednesday beginning after the 11:00 AM Mass and concluding at 8:00 PM.

The Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday Masses will be celebrated in the Church and will be simulcast (audibly & visually) to the Chapel for any overflow. The opportunity to receive Holy Communion will be provided for all overflow.

Lenten Guidelines

Here are the guidelines to help you understand the obligations of fasting and abstinence during the season of Lent:

- Abstinence: A penitential practice of refraining from the consumption of meat and is to be observed by all Catholics who
 are 14 years old age and older.
- Fasting: Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics between the ages of 18-59 (inclusive). On days of fasting one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.
- · Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of both fast and abstinence, and Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence.
- The obligation of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year should still be fulfilled during the period from the First Sunday of Lent, February 26 to Trinity Sunday, June 4. However, the Code of Canon Law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

Palm Sunday - April 13th

"Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of The Lord!" Mark 11:9

We Begin the holiest week of the year with a triumphant shout of praise to Jesus, the son of David. But on this day we also recall in the gospel reading Jesus' suffering and death on a cross. Thus, the two names by which this first day of Holy Week is known are Palm Sunday and Passion Sunday.



Holy Thursday - April 17th

Mass of the Lord's Supper 7:00 P.M.

"Do this in remembrance of me" 1 Corinthians 11:24

The Triduum begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. It commemorates the institution of the Eucharist and Priesthood, as well as Jesus' command of love and service. The Sacred Scripture we hear this night retells the story of the first Passover meal as the Israelites prepared for their journey out of slavery in Egypt. So, too, Jesus prepared us for our journey out of the slavery of sin as He at His final meal with His disciples. This night we also recall in the Gospel that Jesus, although Master and Lord, came to serve and not to be served. This commandment to love and service, he expressed through the washing of the apostles' feet. This is recalled during the institution of the Priesthood. Jesus gave the gift of the Priesthood to his Church on the night before he died, when he commanded the apostles, "Do this in remembrance of me."



We end this night by keeping watch with Jesus, still present with us in the gift of the Blessed Sacrament. Night prayer will conclude this period of adoration at 12 Midnight.

Good Friday - April 18th

The Passion of Our Lord at 3:00 P.M. - Stations of the Cross at 7:00 P.M.

"Father, into your hands I commend my spirit" Luke 23:46

Good Friday is a celebration of the passion, the suffering, and death of Jesus. Because this event won salvation for sinners, the day is called 'Good', and the liturgy reflects on love as much as on loss. We are reminded of the full weight of our sin, even as we are lifted up by the incomparable measure of God's love. Mass is not celebrated this day, but the Church's liturgy consists in a celebration of the Word, veneration of the cross, and the reception of communion.



Holy Saturday April 19th

Easter Vigil at 8:00 P.M.

"Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not here." Mark 16:6 Alleluia! Alleluia!

The Triduum reaches its climax at the Easter Vigil. If there is one Mass in which Catholics should make every effort to participate every year, it is the Easter Vigil. It is the most important celebration of the year. The Easter Vigil has four parts. It begins with a service of light. The community gathers in darkness to hear that Christ is our light, shattering the darkness of sin. The Paschal Candle is lit from the blessed fire and carried into the darkened church, as the Deacon proclaims, "Christ, our light." We respond. Thanks be to God." The second part of the Vigil is the Liturgy of the Word, which provides an overview of salvation history. The liturgy of baptism follows. This year, two elect will be baptized and three candidates will come into full communion and confirmation in the Church. The entire assembly renews its baptismal promises. Together we will pledge our faith in the resurrection and promise to follow Christ more closely. The Vigil's final part is the Liturgy of the Eucharist, during which the new Catholics will join us in the Eucharist for the very first time.







Please keep all of the catechumen and candidates in your prayers as they continue their journey of faith.



<u>Luke 22:14—23:56 (shorter form: Luke 23:1-49)</u>
From the cross, Jesus speaks words of forgiveness and promises that the good thief will be with him in paradise.

Palm Sunday, also called Passion Sunday, marks the beginning of Holy Week. During this week, we prepare ourselves for Easter by prayerful reflection upon the events of Jesus' passion and death. During this week, your family might display a crucifix in a prominent place as reminder of salvation Christ won for us. This can also serve as the focal point for family prayer during Holy Week.

Because of the length and complexity of the passion narrative, it is difficult for children to remain attentive when it is proclaimed in its entirety. Families can make it a tradition to read a portion of this Sunday's Gospel each day of Holy Week, providing ample opportunity for children to ask questions and respond to the events described there. In this way, the entire week can become a "way of the cross."

Each day during Holy Week, the family can gather in a prayerful space with a crucifix as its focal point. The passion as found in Luke's Gospel might be read as follows throughout the week:

Sunday: Luke 19:28-40 (Gospel at the Procession with

Palms)

Monday: <u>Luke 22:14-23</u> Tuesday: <u>Luke 22:24-38</u> Wednesday: <u>Luke 23:39-71</u> Thursday: <u>Luke 23:1-25</u> Friday: <u>Luke 23:26-49</u> Saturday: <u>Luke 23:50-56</u>

After reading from the Gospel each day, the family might reflect on the reading together. Conclude your prayer time together by praying the Lord's Prayer and/or singing an appropriate hymn, e.g., "Jesus, Jesus," "Were You There?" or "What Wondrous Love is This."

The month of April is dedicated to The Holy Spirit.




Second Sunday of the Passion


